



ECONOMIC INCLUSION IN TUNISIAN MIGRATION CORRIDORS

The Inclusive Cities - Quality Public Services and Decent Jobs for All

project aims to promote economic inclusion of rural-urban migrants and poor host communities along the migration corridors surrounding Kairouan, Medenine, and Tataouine. It is based on the concept that strengthening the local systems and creating favourable conditions for individuals in situations of social and economic vulnerability will provide sustainable change.

The project is an innovative local partnership between the Kairouan and Tataouine regional branches of the National Union of Tunisian Women; the Local Democracy Agency in Kairouan; Skills to Succeed, a local development organisation based in Tataouine; and Tunisia Ecotourism, a private agency with expertise in responsible tourism and the circular economy. These partners will work closely with the National Employment Agency, public and private training institutions, and local authorities.



Tunisian women

face more obstacles than men in accessing jobs, support programmes, and financial services.



Women earn 20-40% less

than men and suffer from a highly gendered division of labour.



29% of women

participate in the labour market, compared to **71% of men**.
