Slums are growing by 120,000 people a day SLUM FORMATION > SLUM UPGRADING


What is needed for systemic change and scale?

Systemic Change	 Knowledge fostered new policy environment Exposure to international experiences motivated formulation of national sanitation policy Slum communities engaged as stakeholders not beneficiaries
Scale	 Partnerships forged to introduce sanitation facilities in slum communities Sanitation integrated into broader city planning Financing mechanisms for community sanitation projects operational
Impact	National policy on the provision of universal minimum sanitation in urban areas formulated and approved


