Introduction

Ten years ago, the Cities Alliance and its Cities Without Slums action plan were being launched with great fanfare in Berlin. Within months, before the first CDS or slum upgrading project grant had even begun implementation, the Action Plan target to improve the lives of at least 100 million slum dwellers was incorporated into the Millennium Declaration, the first time an explicitly urban issue had been recognized as an international development target.

Early successes from Cities Alliance funding rapidly followed, with CDS movements catalyzed in South Africa and the Philippines, and in Brazil, being in the right place in the right time, benefitting from the social changes that were to sweep President Lula to power, and bring the issues of cities and slums to the forefront of public policy.

In these countries, the CA brought international experience, a development platform and modest grant funding to catalyze and support local change processes. Most benefited from strong CA member support, sustained over time, often with supplementary (non-core) financial contributions, and were rooted in a strategic context.

A modest portfolio retrospective (2000-2009) has been produced for the Mumbai CG meetings, which provides a reflection on the first decade of some of the CA-funded country activities, highlighting factors behind these and other successes, and the pointing to the lack of sustained success in lower income countries. A summary of the first ten years would point to extremely good name and issue recognition for the Cities Alliance, a relatively strong portfolio but, above all, the need for honesty and humility in learning from the past decade, and identify methods to significantly improve impacts through changes to the business model.

The plan proposed for the next 10 years translates the lessons from the first decade into a strategic work programme that shifts more than 25% of Core resources into a focused and sustained campaign to change the dynamics on city/slum issues in Sub-Saharan Africa, and in low income countries in all regions. Combined with the \$15m Gates Foundation funding for the Land, Services & Citizenship programme, more than 40% of total CA resources would be mobilized to bring systemic change, at scale, to poor countries.

This report reflects the strategies and trade-offs of the re-positioned business model proposed for the Cities Alliance, presented in a separate document. It proposes to catalyze actions in low income countries by bringing together the full capacities and resources of CA members and the local leaders and champions of city/urban development issues – in a given space at a given time – around a strategic framework and a sizeable allocation of CA funding (\$1-\$4m per country).

The WP continues high-impact activities in middle income countries, where the successes reverberate, and the receivers of assistance in the 2000s will increasingly be providing leadership, knowledge and experience to others in the 2010s. This includes implementation of the Partnership Agreements for the dynamic and high-performing WPs on CDS and SU in the Philippines, Brazil and India, which were featured in the Medium-Term Strategy. However, the plan modifies this approach going forward, and focuses it on low income countries.

Whereas the Partnership Agreements set out in the Medium-Term Strategy are a set of strategic and mutually beneficial activities agreed among national government and CA partners, the *country programme* is a more comprehensive approach designed for needs of lower capacity and lower income countries. The country programme uses CA funding as a platform around which local governments can come together, in partnership, with communities, national government and other key stakeholders – facilitated by the Cities Alliance – around an agenda to improve and implement urban policies and strategies, and to share knowledge about these and related issues.

Trade-offs. The plan is financed partially by a restructuring of the Cities Alliance grant facility which was, during the first 10 years, the primary product of the partnership. Funding for the grant facility is proposed to be reduced and put on a fixed budget, and repositioned as a "Catalytic Fund," with a sharper focus around a Results Framework and on causing systemic change.

The budgets for new global knowledge activities will also be reduced during the medium-term. More than \$4m in global knowledge activities are currently underway, much of this implemented by CA members through joint work programmes negotiated with the secretariat. The projects will be completed over the next 2-3 years, and future allocations brought into a more strategic framework.

The proposed WP adds budget, however, for an advocacy plan. Communication and advocacy initiatives will be targeted at low income countries as part of strategic country programmes, and complemented by a campaign to build support among governments, agencies and potential partners in OECD countries, particularly in Europe.

STRUCTURE OF PLAN

The Work Programme and Financing Plan presents current and proposed activities according to the modes of engagement of the re-positioned Cities Alliance business model:

- > country programmes,
- modified grant facility ("Catalytic Fund"),
- knowledge and advocacy programme, and
- > partnership operations

It also presents the type of expected results according to the proposed **Results Framework**, which as the goal to improve living conditions of urban poor by:

- improving local and national government knowledge about urban development ("knowledge");
- elaboration of improved local and national government urban policies and strategies ("elaboration"); and
- implementation of improved local and national government urban policies and strategies ("implementation").

A. Work Programme summary tables and Financing Plans

The tables on following pages provide financial overviews of the on-going and proposed Work Programme, and plans for its financing.

On-Going Funding Allocations

(As of 31 December 2009)

- Approximately \$28m of <u>country-specific and knowledge and advocacy activities</u> were on-going as of end of 2009.
- More than 80% of on-going Core-funded activities were country-specific projects from the open-access grant facility, mostly for <u>elaboration</u> of policies and strategies.
- The plans for 2010-2012 would reduce funding for the open-access facility (Catalytic Fund) to approximately 33% of Core funds, and to less than 24% of total funding (including Gates and Africa Facility).
- Country Programmes would increasly focus on <u>implementation</u> of policies and strategies.

Approved and Recommended Funding Allocations – SUMMARY FY10 to date (As of 31 December 2009)

More than \$9.5m approved during first half of FY10, of which \$6.5m from Core funds. Approval for additional \$0.5m is recommended.
