# Closing of old Grant Facility And Transition to Catalytic Fund

April 14, 2010

At its 21-22 January 2010 meetings, the Cities Alliance Consultative Group agreed to begin the transition to a new Catalytic Fund effective 1 April 2010. All proposals in process or submitted by 31 March were to be "considered in a final batch, evaluated against current CA criteria and taking into consideration the forward direction" of the repositioned CA business model, and then the batch would be submitted to EXCO for decision.

The following briefing summarizes the 31 March batch of proposals and the Secretariat's recommendations to EXCO for moving forward. A funding envelope of \$6.0m from Core Funds is requested for this batch of proposals. EXCO members are not being requested to evaluate individual proposals, but rather to endorse the overall approach taken by the Secretariat, and the associated budgetary implications, and to allow this batch of proposals to be processed through the regular Cities Alliance procedures and due diligence.

#### **SUMMARY OF 31 MARCH 2010 BATCH OF PROPOSALS**

**As of 31 March 2010, the secretariat had received 29 proposals for Core funds requesting a total of \$9.3m**. Two other proposals totaling \$2.0m for funding from Japan Non-Core funds were also received. See detailed listing of proposals, including secretariat's recommendations, starting from page 3.

Of the 29 Core proposals, 24 pass Threshold screening (\$6.9m) and are recommended for continued processing according to normal procedures, and 5 proposals (\$2.4m) are recommended for rejection or for consideration in a future year under new business practices.

The proposals recommended for continued processing consist of:

- ➤ 10 proposals from Low Income countries (\$3.2m)
- ➤ 11 proposals from Middle Income countries (\$3.0m)
- 1 proposal for regional Pacific Island programme support (\$0.5m, linked to 3 proposals for LIC/MIC activities included above)
- 2 proposals for regional/global knowledge & learning (\$0.3m)

In each of these proposals, proponents have worked to prepare funding applications according to the long-established CA criteria and procedures. In some cases, proposals have been in the CA proposal process for many months (eg, Indonesia CDS Process), and in others the proposals have come in after publication of the closing of the old grant facility (eg, Central Africa Republic).

The continued processing of this 31 March portfolio, however, has implications on the funds available for programming over the medium term. The indicative transitional budget brought to Mumbai CG had included \$4.25m in unallocated funding as of 31 December 2009. Approximately \$1m in new allocations were approved during the first quarter of 2010 for proposals which had been advanced stage of processing, leaving \$3.25m unallocated as of 31 March. This is less than half of the requested value of the 31 March proposals that passed threshold (\$6.9m).

Given the good faith that proposal proponents have invested, the balance and overall quality of proposals received, and the lack of definitive additional criteria, the Secretariat recommends that this batch of 24 proposals moves forward. However, it proposes to reduce the portfolio request from \$6.9m to \$6.0m by processing a few proposals at amounts lower than requested. This would include:

- Restructuring a \$500,000 Colombia project to \$225,000 or less because of delays caused by a court challenge to a slum upgrading programme linked to the proposed CA project.
- Propose a more incremental approach to an interesting new proposal received from Central Africa Republic (ie, start with \$300,000 instead of \$500,000).
- Trim approximately \$100,000 each from a newly submitted \$500,000 proposal for Kenya and from a set of two proposals for Malawi (totaling \$750,000).
- ➤ Reduce by \$150,000 the regional knowledge proposal among a set of four proposals totaling \$1.45m for the Pacific Islands. The set of proposals was previously reduced by \$0.5m through adjustments to the three country-specific proposals (Fiji, Samoa and Papua New Guinea). A similar reduction in the regional knowledge and support proposal is also recommended.

Of the five proposals that did not pass Threshold, three are for Low Income Countries and are proposed to be referred to In-Country Programming processes to become effective in FY11 (from July 2010). One proposal is from a Middle Income Country (Jamaica), which can be invited to apply to the new Catalytic Fund when it becomes effective during FY11. Finally, a \$250,000 proposal for an "innovations network" in the Asia and Pacific region did not pass threshold and is not a priority at this time.

#### TRANSITION TO CATALYTIC FUND

The closing of the old grant facility was first step in the transition to the Catalytic Fund – to shut down the old processes so that staff has time for the new processes.

It is expected that most if not all old grant facility business has been captured in this 31 March batch of proposals. However, in the event that other proposals come forward in the next several weeks for which there is clear evidence that the proposals were under development before the announcement of closing the old grant facility, a second and smaller batch of proposals is tentatively scheduled for June 30, 2010. A similar process would be used for this 30 June batch as for the 31 March batch. This 30 June batch will be used **only** as a contingency, and given the large funding requests for the 31 March batch, there will be little funding available for any proposals in that batch.

Meanwhile, as agreed at Mumbai, the secretariat will continue elaborating the conceptual and operational design for in-country programming for cities and local governments, and for the Catalytic Fund. Drafts will be presented to EXCO for its June/July 2010 meeting.
